Firefighter Black Helmets:

Hanover Township Fire District No. 3 and The Cedar Knolls Fire Department have a long standing tradition commonly referred to as "The Black Helmet". A traditional "New Yorker" style "Black Helmet" is presented to a member of the Fire Division who has completed their one-year probationary period, concluded his/her annual training requirements, satisfied all of the quarterly state regulated training and achieved interior structural firefighting status. The "Black Helmet" has been considered as a symbol of achievement and pride, not only in our department but within the fire service in general.

A Probationary Fire Fighter in the Cedar Knolls Fire Department is considered to be an Active Member who has completed his/her training as a Fire Fighter and has not reached the one-year anniversary of their fire Fighter Certification date. A Probationary Fire Fighter is expected to respond to all emergency incidents and is expected to operate as a Fire Fighter while being under the direct supervision of a Fire Officer or Crew Chief. At the conclusion of a firefighter's probationary period the firefighter skills are tested by performing an assessment.

I am proud to announce that three members of the fire division have been recommended after successfully passing their Probationary Firefighter Evaluation.

Two of these firefighters joined the department as junior firefighters at the age of 16 and attended junior firefighter training at the Morris County Safety Academy.

Unit Citation:

This next award was submitted by Assistant Chief Martin of the Fire Division:

On October 27, 2019 Fire & EMS Units were dispatched in the area of 235 Ridgedale Ave on a report of an MVA with injuries. County Communications updated responding units of one victim reported entrapped. Ambulance 39 under the direction of EMT/ Crew Chief Caitlin Williams confirmed one patient entrapped in the vehicle. The initial assignment was upgraded by AC Martin along with a request for additional ambulance and Morris Township Fire.

Command was established by AC Martin and confirmed one patient heavily entrapped in a vehicle. Whippany Fire Department, Morris Township Engine 2 and Cedar Knolls Firefighters worked seamlessly for approximately 16 minutes to remove the patient from the vehicle and turn over to EMS for transport to the hospital.

Exceptional Duty - Life Saving Award:

On the warm and sunny spring afternoon of Saturday May 19 a Cedar Knolls resident was performing spring cleanup and routine maintenance on at his personal residence. The resident was working by himself on a ladder approximately 16-feetup.

A member of the Fire Division, new to the neighborhood, was working in his front yard and heard a loud crashing noise. He looked over to see if the ladder, which he observed earlier against the house, was being put back up or if his neighbor was just moving the ladder, but the ladder did not go back up. The member then walked to the house and heard the patient's wife yell out to her husband after she had come outside and found him on the ground. A large cry for help by the patient and his family members was let out. Identifying the serious trauma that had occurred and the large pool of blood underneath the patient's head the Fire Division member identified the need to hold cervical spine stabilization and direct pressure to the patient's head. EMS was notified via 9-1-1 by a family member. Upon arrival of the ambulance, the two-person crew found the patient was semi-responsive however he did know what day it was, but knew it was May. The patient did not remember the fall or how it happened. The patient was reassured that he fell and that pressure was needed to control bleeding.

The EMT's identified the need to control the bleeding and quickly moved the patient to the ambulance for immediate transport. A rapid trauma assessment also revealed multiple abrasions on the patient. The patient was transported as a full trauma to Morristown Medical Center. Following an extensive hospital and rehabilitation the patent returned home to his family.
